Native plants provide shelter and essential food for birds, but they also help displace the use of fertilizers and carbon-pollution-spewing lawn mowers to improve local watersheds and mitigate climate change. Below is a list of plants that occur naturally in this region.

## **Caterpillar plants**

Warblers, vieros, and many other beloved songibrds depend on these plants to provide caterpillars to feed their babies.
