



Suggested Plants for Schoolyard Habitats: Audu To Benefit Birds and Other Wildlife

Below is a suggested list of plants that work well in various schoolyard habitat locations and conditions. Bloom times were taken into consideration to be heavy during the academic school year. All of the plants on this list will take average conditions with full sun or part sun unless noted otherwise. All of the plants on this list are at least somewhat deer resistant. However, deer do not read lists. Hunger is often a determiner of what is eaten, and, with increased hunger lots of things normally not eaten get munched.
